Parent-Infant Room - available near the back of the sanctuary for fussy children and nursing mothers.

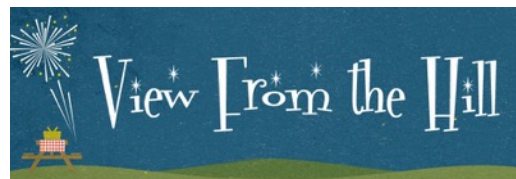
Children's bulletins and crayons are available near the lobby stairs.
